Kim is the Director of Content and Community Partnerships at WFSU Public Media, overseeing all content development for television, radio, and digital platforms as well as on-the-ground community engagement and education projects. She also produces a weekly series called *Voices that Inspire*, which features a diverse array of individuals who are making a difference in our community.

During her leadership at the station, the news team has won several regional Murrow Awards and two national Murrow Awards, and the education team won the top award in community engagement at the National Education Telecommunications annual meeting. In addition, WFSU has been the recipient of a Ready to Learn grant from the US Department of Education in partnership with PBS and the Corporation of Public Broadcasting for the past 20 years, making the education department one of the most respected in the country.

Kim uses her platform at WFSU to work with a variety of non-profits across our community, creating partnerships that help further a student's education. She is a member of Leadership Tallahassee Class 28 and in 2011 was named one of the 25 Women You Need to Know by the Tallahassee Democrat. She is the current president of Capital Women's Network (CWN), has served as a member of the Early Learning Coalition Board of Directors, sits on the United Way of the Big Bend Early Education Committee, and is a past president of the TCC Foundation Board of Directors. She also has served as an advisor to the Florida Afterschool Network, is a founding member of the Family First Tallahassee Summit and a co-founder of ASPIRE, a collective impact initiative to connect youth to career and education opportunities.
