





Credit Hours Fall 2020 vs. Fall 2021







Applicants and Conversion Rates Fall 2020 vs. Fall 2021



Enrollment Status Fall 2020 vs. Fall 2021




Enrollment Type Fall 2020 vs. Fall 2021







New Student Type Fall 2020 vs. Fall 2021




