SUBJECT: Amendment #1 – Educational Plant Survey and Resolution of the Board of

Trustees to Dispose of Real Property

The College has concluded that Buildings #13, #14 and #29 in the College Inventory are unnecessary and unsatisfactory for either educational or ancillary uses. Buildings #13 and #14 were formerly used by the Respiratory Therapy program. Most recently these two buildings were used to store College documents. A more suitable location has been found for the storage in the northwest annex building the College purchased from Leon County School Board.

Building #29 was formerly the concession stand for the baseball team. A new stand was constructed and this building became a storage shed for grounds supplies. In an effort to improve the appearance of this area, this building is considered an 'eye sore'. Additional parking will be constructed in its place.

Section 1013.28, Florida Statutes gives the Board of Trustees authority to dispose of real property that The Board deems unnecessary and unsatisfactory by amending the current Educational Plant Survey. In addition, the Board of Trustees may dispose of any land or real property to which it holds title by Resolution of the Board of Trustees.

Amendment No. 1 Educational Plant Survey dated May 5, 2005, Revised June 29, 2007

Pursuant to section 1013.31 Florida Statutes, administrative staff of Tallahassee Community College has prepared an Amendment to the current Educational Plant Survey for Tallahassee Community College, dated May 5, 2005, Revised June 29, 2007. In accordance with section 1013.31, Florida Statutes, the Amendment shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Trustees.

The new recommendation contained in this Amendment does not affect any existing survey recommendations. Therefore, all previous recommendations remain valid. The following new recommendation is made:

Site 1: Main Campus

Authority:

Pursuant to section 1013.28, Florida Statutes, and section 1.4 (7), State Requirements for Educational Facilities, a Board may dispose of land or real property, which is determined by resolution of the Board to be unnecessary for educational purposes and is recommended in an Educational Plant Survey.

Disposal Recommendation:

Dispose of the Buildings, #13, #14 and #29, located at 444 Appleyard Drive, Tallahassee, FL. And 3900 Century Park Circle, Tallahassee, FL. Respectfully, all at Main Campus, which has been determined by Resolution of the Board of Trustees of Tallahassee Community College to be unnecessary and unsatisfactory for educational purposes.
