Prerequisite:

To be eligible to participate, candidates must have taught a minimum of **one (1)** course at TCC and must also **be teaching at least one (1)** course while participating in ATLAS.

Goals:

To enable participants to use best practices in teaching and learning and provide knowledge of resources at TCC to engage students in active learning that results in increased student achievement.

Objectives:

- Integrate faculty into the TCC educational community
- Promote the professional growth of faculty
- Develop institutional practices that foster a commitment to student learning
- Impact student learning outcomes through improved teaching
- Provide orientation to TCC's student success initiatives
- Project and support a learning-centered teaching philosophy
- Aid with instructional design, integrating technology, active learning, student engagement strategies, assessment, and classroom management

Outcomes:

ATLAS participants will demonstrate enhancement of teaching and learning through a series of reflective activities and assignments. These activities will include the following:

- Synchronous Zoom meetings
- Asynchronous Canvas discussion board postings

Program Requirements:

- Attend four (4) Zoom ATLAS workshops, as detailed in the seminar schedule
- Complete four (4) modules via Canvas, as detailed in the seminar schedule

Participant Responsibilities:

- Attend all Zoom seminar sessions
 - You must be available to virtually attend our seminars on select Tuesdays from 5:00-7:00 pm.
 - If an absence is necessary, email the faculty facilitator in advance or within that same seminar week to notify. Only one absence is allowed during the term for the four (4) seminar sessions.
 Any additional absences must be made up the following semester that ATLAS is offered.
 Stipend for completion will not be provided until this is complete.
- Complete and submit all assignments in the modules on Canvas
- Active participation is necessary during seminars so that everyone is able to get the full experience of the program. This includes participation in discussions, sharing teaching experiences, and completing all assignments.

Compensation:

Upon successful completion of all program requirements listed above, participants will receive a stipend of \$500. This stipend may be delayed until all requirements have been satisfied.
