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THE OUTCOMES

1.) Observation & Communication

3.) De-Escalation

Whether facing a duty to intervene, violent encounter, or other challenging situation, students will learn how the psychological, physiological, and sociological factors of human behavior combined with the limits of human performance can impact and influence any situation. Students will be able to demonstrate to their personnel how to achieve a better, more positive outcome from a Tactical, Operational, and Strategic perspective that supports Federal, State and Local law and aligns with their Departmental policies and procedures. These skills will allow officers and support personnel to influence their agencies culture regarding constant and deliberate de-escalation in every encounter.
