Quarterly Fund Report due 01/10/2022 Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

- Tallahassee Community College has been awarded a cumulative of \$21,488,694 through the American Rescue Plan Act (HR1319), Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) Public Law 116-260, and the initial Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (CARES) Act.
- 2. Tallahassee Community College has received \$20,754,510.75 of the \$21,488,694 for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student.
- 3. The College has distributed the \$20,754,510.75 to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 31, 2021.
- 4. Tallahassee Community College has continued additional disbursements to students facing eviction due to COVID-19 issues, as well as other COVID-19 related financial emergency need. 7,862 students applied for the additional assistance during this quarter. Cumulatively, there were 15,081 students eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965.
- 5. 5,829 students who applied for the eviction-risk and emergency funds as of Fall 2021 were eligible and awarded. TCC paid up to \$1,800 per student. A total of \$9,069,772.02 was distributed to the 5,829 students this quarter, averaging \$1,695.
- 6. Continued fund distribution will be based on economic need and other eligibility criteria. Students must have a completed FAFSA or must have completed a TCC application to be eligible. Ex: for the eviction-risk awards, each student had to submit an application which had to be accompanied by an eviction notice, inclusive of the amount owed to the landlord.
