**When is registration?**

- **Apply for TCC Admission for Fall 2019 Semester & Financial Aid. Please apply late Spring 2019.**
  - TCC Application On-Line at <https://forms.tcc.fl.edu/Application> and pick the option of **Short-term certificate** and choose **CNC Production Specialist (Program Code: 5031)**
  - **Financial Aid Application On-Line at [FAFSA.Gov](https://fafsa.gov)**
  - **Register** - Once you have been accepted - register for your course at <https://eaglenet2.tcc.fl.edu/navigate/student.jsp>! **Register for PMT0026 – CNC Production Technician I**

**How long will it take to complete the program?**

- ~2 semesters totaling 600 clock hours

**What is the class schedule for this program?**

- 6 PM – 10 PM Monday – Thursday; Dates Run Parallel to the TCC Academic Calendar

**How much of the classes are “Hands-on” activities?**

- At least 70%

**Do I need a certain GPA to be accepted to the program; and are there any prerequisites for acceptance to the program?**

- No, but you must have a GED or High School diploma & submit a TCC application and be accepted to TCC

**Do I need to attend TCC Credit Orientation?**

- No, but you will be asked to attend a CNC Production Specialist Orientation

### What credentials could I have once I have completed the program?

- 10 - Hour OSHA for General Industry
- National Institute for Metalworking Skills (NIMS) CNC Milling & Lathe Level I
- National Institute for Metalworking Skills (NIMS) CNC Milling & Lathe Level II

### Are my credentials only good in Florida?

- No. OSHA and NIMS credentials are National and Portable. Certificates are issued in your name, and your progress is recorded in a National Database.

### What is the total Cost of the program?

○ Cost of personal Items (paid out of pocket, not to TCC)	\$ 195.00*

### Do I have to pay for the entire program all at once?

- No. You pay by semester after you register for class. All prices are subject to change.

### What are the enrollment requirements for this program?

- A high school diploma or GED diploma
- Must be at least 17 years of age, and you must turn 18 years of age before achieving CNC Production Specialist I (in order to be eligible for hire by industry)
- **NOTE:** Unless exempt, all students must take the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) within the first semester of enrollment in the program, or present evidence of allowable substitute and earn a score of 9.0 or higher in Mathematics and Reading areas of the TABE and a score of 8.0 in Language. You do not have to take the TABE until you are in the first semester of the program.
